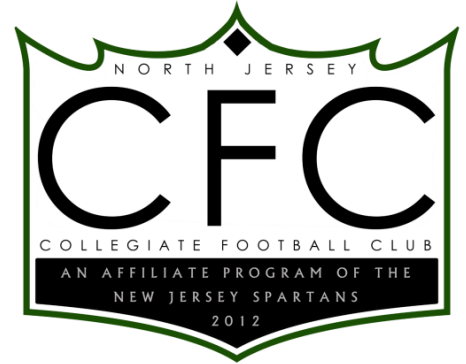


## SPARTANS GO BACK TO SCHOOL
